Study Guide Group Questions: Revelation Ch. 10 & 11

1) Chapter 10 opens with John seeing a mighty angel come down from heaven. Based on the description of this angel, have we seen this angel in a prior chapter of Revelation?

2) What does the little scroll represent that lies open in the angel's hand?

3) In chapter 10 verses 8-10, we see John, for the first time, being asked to participate in the events of Revelation. Why do you suppose John is asked to take and eat the scroll?

4) In chapter 11 we hear the Gentiles will trample the holy city for 42 months and the two witnesses will prophecy 1,260 days. What do the "42 months" and "1,260 days" represent in verse 2-3?

5) John tells us that the "two witnesses" are "the two olive trees" and the "two lampstands." What does this mean?

6) Is there any significance to the two witnesses lying in the street being refused burial for three and a half days which is mentioned in verses 8-10?

7) Why do you suppose that God breathed life back into these two witnesses as opposed to simply allowing them a proper Jewish burial or simply rapturing them up to heaven?

8) There is a significant event that has been prophesied throughout the OT and NT that is coming to fruition in verses 15-19. What is the event?
