Study Guide Group Questions: Revelation Ch. 20

- 1) How many times does John use the phrase "thousand years" in the first seven verses of Revelation 20? Why do you suppose he does?
- 2) List the reasons you think why God establishes a 1000-year period for Christ to rule over the nations which will begin after the Tribulation period is over and Christ returns to earth?

- 3) In Revelation 19, we see that Christ captures the beast (antichrist) and his false prophet and they are thrown alive into the "lake of fire" which we know of as hell and the final place of those who'll experience the "second death." In Revelation 20, why do we see Christ place Satan in the Abyss and not in the "lake of fire" with his evil servants, the antichrist and false prophet?
- 4) The New Testament describes three major future judgements. What are the three judgements and which one of the three do we see occurring in Revelation 20?
- 5) Who are those that will be judged during the judgement in Revelation 20? What will they be judged for?

- 6) How many deaths will the believers of Christ experience, who repent of their sins, who believe that Christ is the resurrected son of God, who trust and accept Christ as their Lord and Savior and that He is the "**only**" way (John 14) to salvation and our reuniting with our Heavenly Father?
